

# Olive Eggers

Hybrid vigor and green eggs!



**This is an Olive Egger hatched in 2017.**

There is a lot of variability in the appearance of the birds and eggs, yours may not look exactly like this one. This one is gold-based, some are silver and the golden brown colors will be replaced with silver white.

If you need some green eggs, try some of our Olive Eggers. The shade of green will vary some between individual hens, and even from week to week, but it will always be unusual. When you crack one of the green eggs, look inside the shell, it will be blue! The green color is a combination of a blue egg shell and a brown pigment coating the outside. We get this color by crossing a blue egg layer (a Cream Legbar) with a dark brown egg layer (a Welbar). This combination is autosexing, like both parent breeds, so you won't get a male accidentally.

These are hybrids and so do not breed true, but hybrid vigor makes them better layers.
